



technology decisions should support the same



- So far in our California Nonprofit Capacity Building efforts we've found...
 - Technology is for building and strengthening relationships, not a replacement for them.
 - Technology challenges are STILL organizational development opportunities in disguise
 - Tech as a solution vs tech supporting the "solution"
